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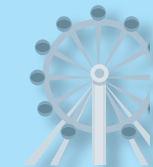

2025-2026 Singapore English Study Tour

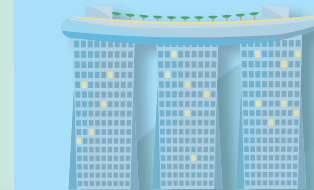
Speak English with pride, with tech as our guide!

Unravel the mysterious world of Night Safari



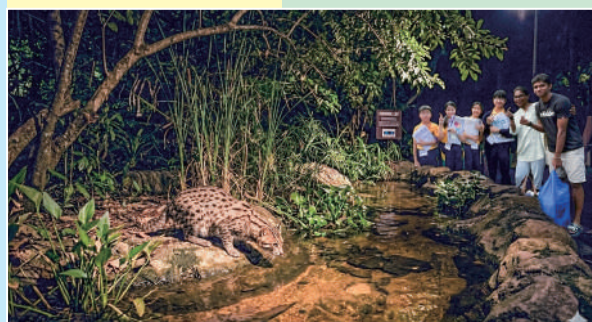
Creatures of the Night

Visit to the Science Centre Singapore: DNA Learning

During our visit to the Science Centre Singapore, we became junior forensic scientists. We learned how real detectives solve mysteries using genetics. First, we practised using micro-pipettes to handle tiny liquid samples. Then, we used the PCR technique to copy and amplify hidden DNA fragments from a simulated crime scene. Finally, we loaded our samples into a gel electrophoresis machine. By passing an electric current through the gel, we separated the DNA bands and safely compared the glowing patterns. We learned that every individual has a unique DNA profile, making it a powerful tool for modern justice!
